
## THE BIG WAVE






The nation of Japan is composed of four main large islands and a series of smaller islands off of the eastern edge of Asia in the Pacific Ocean.



The four main islands are Hokkaido, Honshu, Shikoku, and Kyushu. Another famous island is the island of Okinawa, where the USA has military bases built to protect the Japanese since World War II.



Japan is a geographic landform called an archipelago. Japan consists of a grouping of 6,852 islands. It is surrounded on the south by the Philippine Sea, on the southwest by the East China Sea, on the west by the Sea of Japan, and on the east by the North Pacific Ocean.






